

Divine Mercy Reflections from St. Faustina's Dairy

Jesus said: During Holy Mass, which was celebrated by Father Andrasz, I saw the Infant Jesus who, with hands outstretched toward us, was sitting in the chalice being used at Holy Mass. After gazing at me penetratingly, He spoke these words: **As you see Me in this chalice, so I dwell in your heart** (*Diary, 1346*)

Jesus said: **There are souls with whom I can do nothing. They are souls that are continuously observing others, but know nothing of what is going on within their own selves. They talk about others continually, even during times of grand silence, which is reserved for speaking only with Me. Poor souls, they do not hear My words; their interior remains empty. They do not look for Me within their own hearts, but in idle talk, where I am never to be found.** (*Diary, 1717*)

Catholicism — largest denomination in U.S.

At roughly 22% of the population of the United States Catholicism is the largest religious denomination in the country with approximately 77.4 million members as of 2017.

After Brazil, Mexico and the Philippines, the US comprises the world's fourth-largest Catholic population. Similarly, the country consists of both the largest Catholic population of English-speakers and the largest population of Catholic minorities. The US Conference of Catholic Bishops is the central leadership body of the Catholic Church in the US.

According to Worldatlas.com the states with the most Catholics are: Rhode Island ranks first with the largest population of Catholic residents, at 42%, Massachusetts, New Jersey and New Mexico are tied for second place with Catholics accounting for 34% of the those states' populations. Ohio has 18 % Catholics and Mississippi is the state with the fewest Catholics at only 4%.

Ohio's First Abortion Clinic Now Closed

After 47 years in operation, 30 of them at 1243 E Broad Street, Ohio's first abortion clinic is out of business. This closure is both a real and a symbolic victory for the unborn children of our community and the pro-life advocates who have been steadfast in their efforts to bring prayer, witness, and real help to the sidewalks outside of Founder's.

Before we celebrate this wonderful news, we should pause for a few moments to remember the unborn children who have died at Founder's and those who mourn them. While we cannot know the numbers, a reasonable calculated from available reports suggests that between 75,000 and 100,000 abortions were committed at the current location and perhaps as many as 25,000 to 50,000 (or more) at previous locations.
