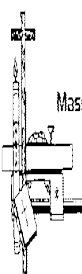

It would be a big help if you could label your bags of clothing "children", "women" or "men".

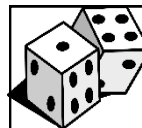

What is the difference between a Nun and a Sister?

The terms "nun" and "sister" are often used interchangeably. However within Roman Catholicism, there is a difference between the two.

Both nuns and sisters are women religious and constitute a most beautiful way of serving Jesus Christ and all souls in the Church.

A nun takes solemn and public perpetual vows of chastity, poverty and obedience and typically spends her life in prayer and work and silence in a cloistered convent. Nuns are responsible for helping to support their convent. Monasteries are supposed to be entirely self-sufficient, so nuns work in gardens to help feed the sisters. They may develop a part-time job or trade such as selling church art or religious icons. They may sell baked goods or quilts.

Sisters are bound by temporary, simple vows. Sisters are free to leave the convent and to participate in active charitable work oftentimes in such areas as education and healthcare.

Within Christianity, nuns or sisters, are found in Catholic, Anglican and Lutheran traditions among others.
