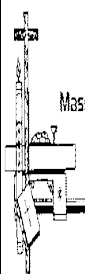

Masks at Mass

After discussion with the Diocese and the governor's new rule I must request that masks be worn to Church unless you have a legitimate reason or health issue. Children under 10 are exempt. Health conditions can include but not limited to: asthma, emphysema or lung condition which are exacerbated by the mask, and anxiety/claustrophobia making the mask intolerable.

Take the mask down before receiving communion.

I realize this is a difficult subject for many, myself included, but as I said in my homily this past week as Catholics we need to submit to the authority of the Church. Prayerfully consider wearing a mask to Church. – Deacon Dave
