

St. Elizabeth of Hungary Tidbit

St. Elizabeth of Hungary was born in 1207, a princess and medieval noblewoman.

She married Louis of Thuringia, a German nobleman. They had a happy marriage, having three children. Louis died after they had been married only 6 years. Elizabeth was devastated by her husband's death and vowed to never marry again.

Elizabeth was pious from her youth. She devoted herself to works of charity throughout her life. Elizabeth met with friars of the Franciscan order during St. Francis' own lifetime. She followed the guidance of her confessor and spiritual director from this order. After her husband's death, she became a Third Order Franciscan. She had resolved to use her royal position to advance their mission of charity. Elizabeth led a life of prayer and sacrifice and service to the sick and poor.

She died at the age of 24. Soon after her death, there were reports of miraculous healings at her grave site.

She is the patron saint of bakers, brides, death of children, homeless people, hospitals, widows, Sisters of Mercy, Catholic charities and the secular Franciscan order.
