- We help the Turban Project with their workdays and also donation jewelry.

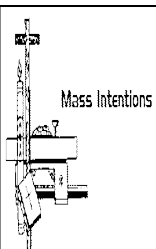
We are a kind, caring Parish Family incorporating the Corporal Works of Mercy.

**Laundry Soap
Ministry**

In 2020 we donated 435 gallons of our homemade laundry soap. 255 gallons were donated to the food pantry at Coburn United Methodist Church, Maple Ave., Zanesville. 175 gallons were donated to the Frazeysburg Food Pantry and five gallons were donated to the Sisters of Children of Mary, Newark.
