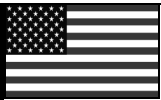

Fasting is not officially required but goes along well with abstinence.
Some people fast during the entire 40 days, especially from animal products: meat, dairy, eggs, broth, or anything from animals.

Diocese has 40 Days of Adoration during Lent

Bishop Robert Brennan calls upon the Diocese of Columbus to celebrate Jesus Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist in a special way this Lent.

Every day for the 40 days of Lent, a different parish throughout the diocese will host Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for Adoration throughout the day.

Following the ancient custom, you are invited to spend time with Jesus in the Eucharist at different host parishes on their day of Adoration. The schedule of host parishes is available at columbuscatholic.org/40days.
