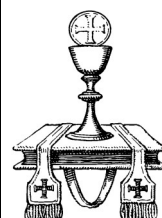

#### **May Highlights:**

Abigail—found in the Bible in 1 Samuel; 25 and referenced in 2 Samuel 3:3., is described as the “woman with beauty and brains”. Abigail was married to Nabal who was described as selfish, unmanageable, stubborn and ill-tempered. He was often “very drunken” and was an unbeliever. He was a follower of Saul and shared the rejected king’s jealousy of David. David requested assistance for food from Nabal who refused. Abigail learned of David’s request and her husband’ refusal and took it upon herself to gather and take food to David and his men, averting David’s just anger and changing his mind about attacking Nabal and his men. Nabal died and Abigail later married David. The Lord honored Abigail for her consistency, generosity, and willingness to continue on the right path, no matter how difficult.
