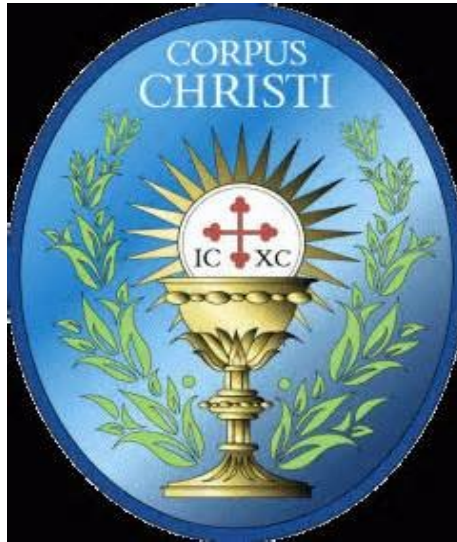

The Feast of Corpus Christi, or the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ

(as it is often called today), goes back to the 13th century, but it celebrates something far older: the institution of the Sacrament of Holy communion at the Last Supper. While Holy Thursday is also a celebration of this mystery, the solemn nature of Holy Week and the focus on Christ's Passion on Good Friday, overshadows that aspect of Holy Thursday.

Corpus Christi is Latin for Body of Christ.

The feast of Corpus Christi owes a large debt to St. Juliana, a nun of Liege, Belgium, who was led to start a celebration of the Mass around AD 1230. At an early age, she developed a strong devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, and she longed for a feast in honor of the Eucharist. In AD 1264 Pope Urban IV instituted the observance of the feast. St. Thomas Aquinas is given credit for many of the customs and hymns associated with Corpus Christi.

The Feast of Corpus Christi is celebrated throughout the Catholic Church.

Corpus Christi is included in the calendar of a few Anglican churches most notably the Church of England. It was retained in the Lutheran Church's calendar until about 1600.
