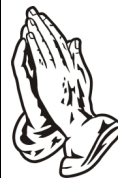
### Divine Mercy Reflections from St. Faustina's Diary

*Tidbit on St. Margaret of Castello*

St. Margaret of Castello (1287-1320), from Italy, was born with a number of physical disabilities.

Her wealthy parents were ashamed of her and kept her hidden away for a number of years. Then they took her to a church in Castello, hoping for a healing miracle. When this did not occur, they abandoned her. Margaret was cared for by the townspeople and adoptive parents. She became a secular member of the Third Order of St. Dominic.

Through this she ministered to those around her and won the affection of everyone in Castello. Margaret said that she saw the image of the suffering Christ in her neighbors. She regarded her own disabilities as a means to unite her pain with the pain Christ endured on the cross.

Margaret is the patron saint of the poor and anyone dealing with a disability or physical challenge. She also is venerated as one of the patron saints of the pro-life movement and those who are unwanted. Pope Francis declared her a saint through equipollent canonization on April 24, 2021.
