Hannah, married to Elkanah, was barren. Elkanah's other wife, Peninah had children and tormented Hannah because of this. During a yearly prayer/sacrifice trip, Hannah went to the Temple and poured out her heart silently and passionately to God. She vowed that if she would be granted a son, she would in return offer that child for service in the temple when the child was weaned. Eli, the high priest assured her that her prayers for a child would be answered.

God granted Hannah the gift of a child, whom she named Samuel. Hannah honors her pledge literally and presents Samuel to Eli after weaning. Samuel became the last of Israel's judges, a great prophet, and
