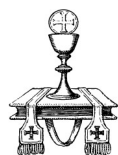

***Tidbit on The Woman at the Well***

The Women of the Church Study Group studied the Woman at the Well during September. Her story is found in John 4:4-42. It is said that this woman's encounter with Jesus is the longest between the Messiah and any other individual in the Gospel of John. There are many lessons and perspectives which can be reflected upon and gained from this story.

It is a story of love, truth, redemption, and acceptance. Jesus goes beyond cultural norms and expectations to encounter this woman. During their interaction, he offers her "living water" and talks with her about worshipping in "spirit and truth". She becomes the first person to whom Jesus openly reveals himself as Messiah. This woman, ostracized from her community due to her lifestyle, is suddenly and radically transformed by Jesus. She quickly and boldly witnesses to others in her community, leading them to salvation through Jesus.

Although the woman is not named in the Bible, the Eastern Orthodox and Eastern Catholic traditions celebrate her as a saint, with the name "Photine" (which means "luminous one"). It is said that she led so many to the faith that she was brought before the emperor Nero to answer for this; she later died as a martyr.
