ST MARY'S CEMETERY RULES

Effective Aug 31, 2019

Cemetery disclaims all responsibility for loss, damage, or vandalism.

Pastor reserves the right to remove any vegetation that interferes with operations.

Pastor reserves the right to remove or prune any vegetation that obstructs or mars the beauty of the scenery or is determined to be unsightly or detrimental.

Visitors are not allowed in cemetery between sunset and sunrise.

Visitors are not allowed in cemetery during mowing.

Vehicles speed limit in cemetery is 15 MPH.

Trash or rubbish in the cemetery is prohibited.

Pets are not allowed in the cemetery.

Monuments or foundations are not allowed until lots are paid in full.

Monument footing width must be less than 36" on a single 40" X 12' grave site.

Fence, wire, curbs or enclosures of any kind are prohibited.

Trees, plants, or vegetation of any kind must be approved by Pastor.

Flower pots, vases, and any ceramic or glass containers are prohibited.

Shepherd hooks, eternity candles, solar lights, and other unsightly objects are prohibited.

Flowers and other decorations must be mounted to top of monument.

1 internment and 2 urns will be allowed on each grave site.

Above ground monuments must be at head of grave. Foot of grave monuments must be flush with ground.

Each year, 2 weeks before Palm Sunday, all approved and unapproved flowers, wreaths, grave blankets, and other decorations will be removed and discarded. If you wish to save an approved item, remove it 2 weeks before Palm Sunday and replace it after Palm Sunday.

Cremation sites are 40" by 40", allow 1 burial per site, and allow a small marker flush with ground.

Only authorized cemetery personnel may bury cremations.

APPROVED ITEMS: Flowers, Wreaths, Saddles for top of monument, Grave wreaths during winter months.

NON-APPROVED ITEMS: Shepherd hooks, eternity candles, statues, glass or ceramic containers, fencing, curbing rods, solar lights, or any vegetation or decoration not approved by Pastor.

Copies of Cemetery rules are available in back of church.
