I was told the Bible says the dead don't know what happens on earth. Is that true?

This is a reference to the book of Ecclesiastes, which says, "For the living know they will die, but the dead no longer know anything" [Ecc 9:5]. Some groups seize upon that statement to propose that the dead go into a state of suspended consciousness called "soul sleep". In this state they would cease to have conscious experience awareness until the resurrection of the dead. What they fail to take into account is the type of literature one reading in the book Ecclesiastes. Right from the start, the author says his task is to record the wisdom of world [Ecc 1:12]. What follows is a cynical, pessimistic description of the world from an outlook that is devoid of God. So you get gems like, "wine gives cheer to life while money is the answer to everything" Ecc 10:191 statements saving life is horrible

and not worth living [Ecc 4:3]. It is in that perspective that the author says, "the dead know nothing."

On the other hand, in Luke 15 we find The Parable of the Lost Sheep. which Jesus concludes by saving, "There will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous men who do not need to repent." That shows the denizens of heaven will be aware of such an event. In Hebrews 12, the sacred author describes all the dead heroes of the Old Testament as a "cloud of witnesses". Further on, we see Moses and Elijah being aware of earthly events during Transfiguration. Lastly, Revelation 8:3 the martyrs in Heaven are shown crying out to God for justice to be done on the earth. Taken together, these show that our beloved dead do retain awareness of earthly matters. In conclusion, our beloved dead that are in heaven are actively praying to the Father for us. Remember we are in the month of November: the month where we specifically remember those who have gone before us in death. Pray to them, that they might intercede to God on your behalf!
