From our Pastor: THE WORD OF GOD - Part 2: INSPIRATION

There are a few things that we should probably go over before we go deep into what Pope Benedict wants to share with us. They are some of the practicals you probably haven't heard since Catholic school or CCD class a lifetime ago.

One of the main things you will hear from our Protestant brethren is that we Catholics added books to the Bible. This accusation hits on two foundational topics in Biblical theology: *inspiration* and *canonicity*. I will write about the first today because it effects the second.

As I said last week, the Scriptures are the word of God, that He Himself speaks to us through them. This is true, but His word didn't come to us directly, but rather came through the words of human authors. Pope Benedict explains it well: "As the word of God became flesh by the power of the Holy Spirit in the womb of the Virgin Mary, so sacred Scripture is born from the womb of the Church by the power of the same Spirit ... In this way one recognizes the full importance of the human author who wrote the inspired texts and, at the same time, God himself as the true author" (*Verbum Domini*, 19). Pope Benedict sets up this concept much better, but this'll do for now.

What this means is: What we read in Scripture is the truth. "We must acknowledge that the books of Scripture firmly, faithfully, and without error, teach that truth which God, for the sake of salvation, wished to see confided to the sacred Scriptures" (*Verbum Domini*, 19). If they would speak falsity, they would cease to come from God, who is truth, and, therefore weren't inspired. We trust that what the Scriptures say is true, and nothing but the truth. This should bring other questions to bear, and I hope to answer them in greater detail later.

One question, I will certainly answer next week. Who or what determines which writers were inspired and which weren't? That is *canonicity*.
