BUTTONS AND CAROL LEBLANC

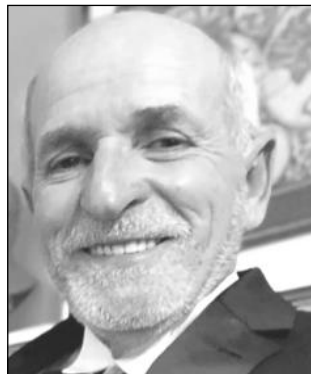
