Safe Environment training

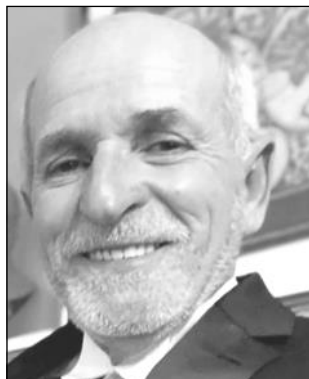

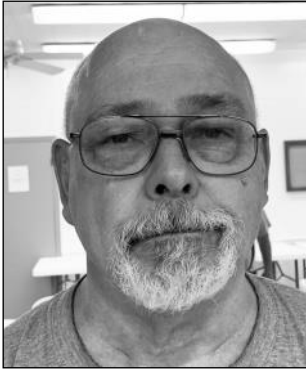
