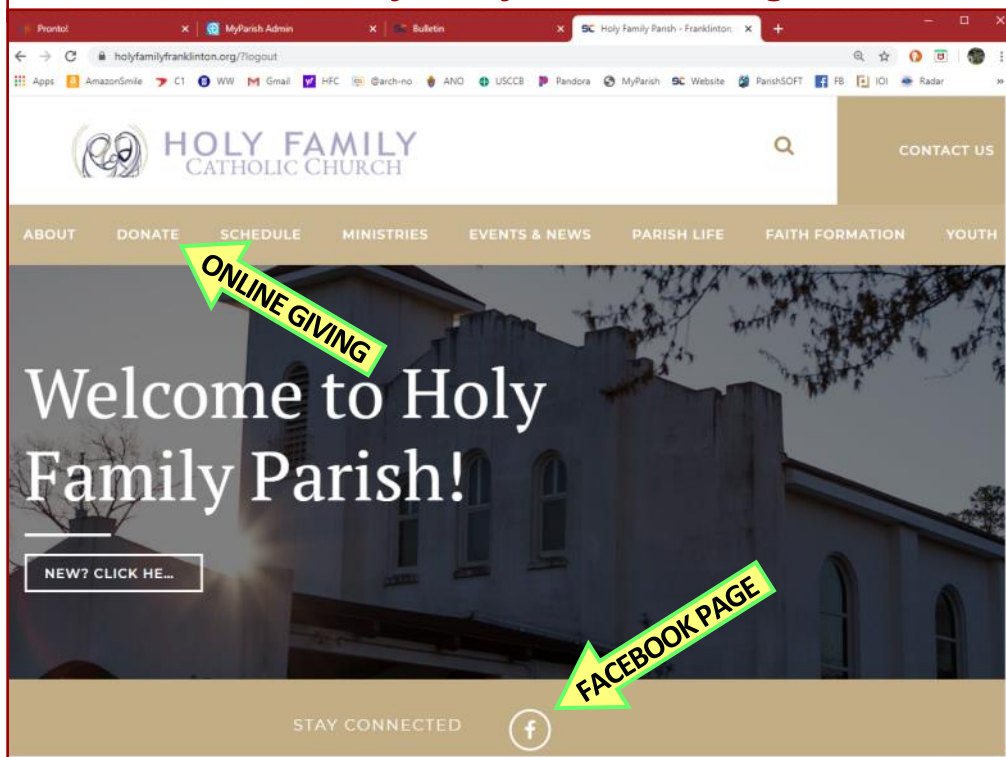

## From Our Pastor

There's a lot of fear in the air. Many in this parish can be considered at-risk. I hope you're practicing social distancing out of respect for our neighbors as well as prudent protection of ourselves. For some of us, social distancing is easy; for others, the Lord provided you with an extra Lenten penance. Either way, this time away from the sacraments and away for our community needs to be a time for prayer. Take advantage of the "interior cell" St Catherine was so fond of. She desired above all to live as a consecrated religious, but her parents wouldn't let her, so they forced her to basically be the family slave: cleaning, cooking, being subservient to the whims of her family. She couldn't spend time in prayer before the Eucharist or with the Scriptures, so she set up in her own heart an "interior monastic cell" where she could pray. Now you may not be enslaved; you *are* robbed of the Eucharist. Find God, where He already is, dwelling within you. Adore Him there. Speak to Him. Listen to Him. There's no need to distance from Him.
