FROM THE PASTORS DESK

Fr. Al

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Anthony's,

After last week some people who read my bulletin article about "Dealing with Discouragement" came to me telling me of another wonderful Saint of our time that didn't give into that powerful emotion. They were relating to me the story of St. Josephine Bakhita. Josephine is truly a hero not only because she did not give into discouragement, but also in the fact that she did not resent the people who were maliciously cruel to her. She prayed for them. A good reading of Romans 12 would describe Josephine. "Never repay injury with injury....do not conquer by evil but conquer evil with good." While we can not go into her whole life now, it would suffice to say that she did well in putting the teaching of Jesus into practice.

Years ago, while at another assignment I had the happy fortune of meeting a lady whose name I will not mention. She told me that I reminded her of her brother who was a priest. He grew up in Holy Name parish in Northeast, Washington and was sent to do mission work in Vietnam. While I know most of our priests in the Archdiocese, this is one priest that I had not had the fortune of meeting. His name was Fr. Aloysius Schwartz. By the time I was ordained a priest (1986), Fr. Al had a thriving ministry in Vietnam. I never met Fr. Al, but in chatting with his sister I felt that I had known him all my life. Recently I ran into that same sister and she told me that his cause is up for Beatification and Canonization in Rome. She gave me a prayer card with Father's picture on it with a prayer on the back that I pray every morning as I sit in my prayer room in the rectory.

As far as I know the Archdiocese of Washington has no canonized saints in her history. While there are many saintly people in our midst, it would be a great honor and privilege to have a man like Fr. Al receive the honor of sainthood. We are all called to be saints. May someone like Fr. Al inspire you as he has inspired me. I would encourage you to pray this intercessory prayer daily for the cause of his sainthood:

Almighty, ever-living God, giver of all good gifts, You have filled Venerable Al with an ardent love for you and for souls. You have inspired him to dedicate his life to relieve the suffering of the orphans, abandoned, the sick and the poor especially the youth, with all humility and courage until the end of his life. May his holy life of love and service to the poor be recognized by the Church through his beatification and canonization. For your honor and glory, we pray that the life of Venerable Al be an inspiration for us in striving for perfection in the love of God and service to others. Bestow on us, through his intercession... (mention the favor you ask for). We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son and the maternal aid of Mary, the Virgin of the Poor. Amen.

After this pray one "Our Father" one "Hail Mary" and one "Glory Be".

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT DECEMBER 2ND, 2018

First Reading: Jeremiah 33:14-16

The Lord tells of fulfilling the promise he had made to Israel. He will send a replacement for David, someone who "shall do what is right and just in the land," believed by most to mean Jesus.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 3:12-4:2

Paul encourages the Thessalonians to be ready for the coming of the Lord. He explains that although they are conducting themselves in a way that would please God, they should always strive to do even better.

Gospel: Luke 21:25-28, 34-36

Jesus warns his followers to be prepared for the end of the world. He reminds them not to be preoccupied with unimportant events, or they will be caught unaware rather than being on watch as they should.
