FROM THE PASTORS DESK

The Blessing of throats and the Ministry of Blaise

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Anthony's,

Today we celebrate the fourth Sunday of Ordinary time. However, this Sunday happens to fall on February 3rd, which traditionally we also celebrate the Feast Day of St. Blaise, or Blasé.

Blaise was a fourth century bishop in Armenia who suffered martyrdom for his faithfulness to Jesus Christ. However, he is best known for his miraculous cure of a little boy who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. Blaise is prayed to often when people have some type of throat disease or an illness related to their throats.

In the Catholic Church there are all types of special blessings and practices which is one of the reasons I love the Church so much. It is good to be aware that as wonderful as these little Catholic benefits are, they never become more important than our personal relationship with Jesus Christ. In the Church, the temptation has always been to make these blessings and other devotional practices more important then Jesus Christ. The seven Sacraments are the essential way to encounter the Risen Christ; all the other things, whether it be the blessing of St. Blaise, the ashes on Ash Wednesday or the palms on Palm Sunday are secondary. Important as they are, they need to be put in their proper place.

Years ago, as a child, I remember receiving the blessing of St. Blaise; I was fortunate to grow up in a parish that retained many of the traditional practices of Catholicism. Having a raspy throat that morning I thought to myself that the blessing of St. Blaise would fix me up and the sore throat would be cured. When to my surprise this didn't happen, I was disappointed in the blessing of the throats. My good parents set me straight and reminded me that the blessing is not some feat of a magician but a more powerful remedy to edifying speech and to use your gift of speech well.

While looking up the facts of Blaise's life, I stumbled upon this beautiful prayer that I would like to share with you:

"O Blessed St. Blaise you received from God the powers to protect men from throat disease and other maladies. Take away the illness that afflicts me, keep my throat healthy and perfect so that I can talk correctly and be able to proclaim and sing praises to God. I promise you, St. Blaise, that the words coming from my mouth will always speak: The truth and not lies; justice and not calumnies; goodness and not harshness; forgiveness and not condemnation; pardon and not accusation; respect and not disparagement; conciliation and not intrigue; calmness and not irritation; unselfishness and not egotism; edification and not scandal; enthusiasm and not defeatism; conformity and not complaint; love and not hate; joyfulness and not sadness; faith and not disbelief; hope and not despair."

St. Blaise, keep my throat free from illness so that I can praise God, my creator, and thank you, my protector. AMEN.

FIFTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME FEBRUARY 10TH, 2019

First Reading: Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8

Isaiah recounts the awe he felt the first time he saw the Lord, who was surrounded by angels. He began to feel despair because he was a man of unclean lips, until an angel touched an ember to his lips and pronounced them clean. The Lord asked who he should send forth, to which Isaiah replied, "Here I am, send me!"

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

Paul reminds the Corinthians that Christ died for us to free us from our sins. He encourages them to remember the importance of Jesus' death and resurrection. He admits that he initially failed to believe, and therefore was very grateful to be called an apostle and preach in the name of Christ.

Gospel: Luke 5:1-11

Luke tells of Jesus preaching to a crowd, then joining Peter who was about to end a fruitless day of fishing. He told Peter to lower his net back in, and a great number of fish were caught. Upon seeing this, Peter and his companions, James and John, immediately abandoned their nets to follow Jesus.
