FROM THE PASTORS DESK

The Town of Nazareth

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Anthony's,

Yesterday was March 25th, which is the Feast of the Annunciation. Being Monday, I went to the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception for my weekly pilgrimage for confession. The place was packed with pilgrims to "Mary's House" which was expected for the feast day.

Naturally, my mind slipped away to memories of another church, thousands of miles away in the town of Nazareth in Israel. The Church, while not as grand as the Shrine, is very lovely and it has, below the main church, something which is truly awe-inspiring and beautiful. It is the remains of the original church built around the turn of the century by the crusaders. It is here that you read the words "Verbum Caro Hic Factum Est." The small Latin word "Hic" means "Here". This is the only place in the world where the small Latin word "Hic" fits into the scenario. Everywhere else in the world we say Verbum Caro Factum Est; like at the Church of the Annunciation in Washington, DC where I was privileged to be stationed years ago while working in vocations. It was there that I met Monsignor Montgomery, one of the great pastors of our Archdiocese.

The town of Nazareth is one of our stops on the pilgrimage that we will be making this Spring, and I look forward to once again visiting this place where Jesus grew up as a boy and worked in the carpenter shop with Joseph.

In the course of history there are many instances where God broke into the human scenario. We have God coming to Adam and Eve, and of course Moses and the burning bush. All the prophets were privy to the Words of God, so that they could speak on behalf of God. But only in this small town of Nazareth did the Word, definitively break into human history and change the course of human history. It was the turning point of all history. And the world would never be the same.

Mary's "Fiat" or yes, is the example we need to follow during these days of Lent. Asking ourselves what God wants to accomplish in this life given to us as His gift. The message which has always been at the heart of the Pro-Life teaching of the Church is that all human life has meaning, and that God called us into existence to fulfill a certain task that only we can accomplish.

Years ago I celebrated a funeral for an old lady who outlived all her relatives and friends. There was only one person at the funeral besides me. The lady's grandson asked to say some words of remembrance to the congregation (I was the entire congregation). What the grandson said has always stuck with me. He basically said that everyone in his life had given up on him. He had no friends. But that his grandmother never gave up on him. She was his hero!!! I was deeply moved. If this was the grandmother's purpose in life, than so be it. All life has a meaning and purpose.
