Litany of Trust

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Anthony’s,

Today we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. I would like to share the Divine Mercy “Trust” litany with you in this pastor’s column but before I do this, I just want to share a reflection about being in the place where it all happened. Back in 1999 I took some pilgrims to Poland. It was a pilgrimage that spoke to both the Highs and the Lows of the spiritual barometer. The High point was being in the chapel where St. Faustina received the various revelations that are so needed for our time. The Low point was a visit to the concentration camp in Auschwitz. Even though Auschwitz was somewhat “Hellish”, there was a very bright light that shined in the cell block that kept St. Maximillian Kolbe confined. It’s always interesting to me how God can bring beautiful light out of apparent darkness.
