## FROM THE PASTORS DESK

#### The Month to Remember the Dead

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Anthony's,

Last Saturday the parish celebrated a most beautiful Mass for the repose of the souls of our parishioners who have died and have been called by the heavenly Father to their eternal reward. I look forward to this Mass every year because it reminds me of the beautiful souls who have passed through this world in their journey to God.

Years ago, I was given a prayer card at a time when I lost my father. I have kept it tucked away in the prayer book that I use at this time of the year. November has traditionally been the month that the Church remembers the dead. We begin with a celebration of all the Saints and follow it up a day later for all the souls. We remember each of them with tenderness and affection. They are and will always be souls uniquely willed by God Himself to be given life in this world and to be happy with God for all eternity.

I would life to share this prayer card with you. It is a quote from Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Dietrich was a German pastor, theologian, anti-Nazi, and key founding member of the "Confession Church". He lived in Poland during the Nazi occupation and was captured and put to death in the concentration camp in Flossenburg, Germany on April 9th, 1945. His classical work was entitled "The Cost of Discipleship" and was written in 1937. He writes concerning death, and I quote:

"Nothing can make up for the absence of someone whom we love and it would be wrong to try to find a substitute....That sounds very hard at first, but at the same time it is a great consolation, for the gap, as long as it remains unfilled, preserves the bond between us.

It is nonsense to say that God fills the gap; he doesn't fill it, but on the contrary, he keeps it empty and so helps us keep alive our former communion with each other, even at the cost of pain.

The dearer and richer our memories, the more difficult the separation. But gratitude changes the pangs of memory into a tranquil joy.

We must take care not to wallow in our memories or had ourselves over to them, just as we do not gaze all the time at a valuable present, but only at special times, and apart from these keep it simple as a hidden treasure that is ours for certain."

This beautiful reflection, from a man who suffered much, speaks powerfully of the God who makes us so exquisitely unique that we can never be replaced. Bonhoeffer was a Lutheran Pastor. He pastored well by laying down his life for the sheep. I pray we can do the same.
