Dear Friends,

Amos was a shepherd before God called him to be a prophet. When Jesus sent the twelve out for the first time He told them to take nothing with them. If no special preparation or equipment is needed to preach why did I spend six years in the seminary? If we read the whole of Scripture we realize that God is not saying we should never prepare or make use of the abilities and goods God has given us. What God is calling for us to do is act on the Word immediately.

Everyone is called to holiness. Holiness resides in God, so only through union with God can we be holy. That holiness reaches its fullness in heaven, but begins here on earth. What Amos and the twelve need to go out on their mission is a deepening relationship with God. Since God is the ultimate creator and conserver of all creation including each of us, even those who reject God have a relationship to God. Everyone whether rich or poor, educated or uneducated, young or old, can grow closer to God.

Growing closer to God is the one thing necessary for going on any mission. Individual missions may call for extra preparation, such as seminary training for priests, but result of any of these missions depends on God's power.

To go on the mission we need to grow closer to God, and to draw closer to God we need to go on the mission. Just as Jesus puts love of God and love of neighbor into one commandment, He also puts our interior and exterior life together. We are to be filled with the light of Christ and to be the light of the world. How are you fulfilling your mission to bring God into the world?

#### **Catechetical Corner**

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops(USCCB) identifies seven themes in Catholic Social Teaching: Life and Dignity of the Human Person, Call to Family, Community and Participation, Option for the Poor and Vulnerable, Rights and Responsibilities, Solidarity, Care for God's Creation, and The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers.

The third theme is the Option for the Poor and Vulnerable. A basic moral test of a society is how it treats the most vulnerable members. In a world marred by many divisions, our tradition recalls the story of the Last Judgment (Mt 25:31-46) and instructs us to put the needs of the poor and vulnerable first.

One of the needs that is often forgotten, even as we tend to someone's physical needs, is the need to be treated with respect. Just because someone lacks this or that, does not them any less in the eyes of God. It should not make them less in our eyes either.
