OCTOBER

Sunday, Oct 13, Starts at 9:45 am	<p>"Thou shalt not steal." Six-year old Ania is being brought up by Ewa in the belief that Majka, Ewa's daughter, is her sister, whereas Majka is really her mother. Majka has reached an age and a maturity where she wants the truth to be known so she can now raise her daughter, but her mother protests. After watching the video and learning about the other complicating factors involved in this situation, what is the right thing to do?</p>
Sunday, Oct 20	<p>No Session</p>
Sunday, Oct 27, Starts at 9:45 am	<p>"Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's goods." A black comedy of financially strapped brothers who unexpectedly inherit a small fortune when their father dies, leaving them the most valuable stamp collection in Poland.</p>

NOVEMBER

Sunday, Nov 3, Starts at 9:45 am	<p>"Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain." Dorota visits her dying husband in the hospital. She is pregnant by another man. She asks the doctor for her husband's prognosis – considering abortion should he live, choosing life for the fetus if her husband dies. Knowing this, what should the doctor do? Will the doctor's actions determine the life or death of the unborn child?</p>
Sunday, Nov 10 Starts at 9:45 am	<p>"Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor." Elzbieta, researching the fate of Jewish war survivors, is visiting from New York and sits in on lectures in ethics at the University of Warsaw. An ethics professor is forced to acknowledge her past as Elzbieta reveals herself as the young Jewish girl whom the ethics professor refused to hide from the Nazis during the Occupation. Does what happens next restore one's faith in humanity?</p>
Sunday, Nov 17, Starts at 9:45 am	<p>"Thou shalt not kill." A psychotic youth randomly and brutally murders someone. Arrested, he is given a young lawyer to defend him. Is an eye for an eye just? Does the legal system have the right to kill?</p>
Sunday, Nov 24 Starts at 9:45 am	<p>"Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's wife." A once promiscuous, but now impotent doctor encourages his wife to take a lover. Consumed by jealousy that she may have taken his advice, he obsessively spies on her until he finds out the truth. Did she take his advice?</p>
