

Nov 12, 2019 Weekly Report from Oblate Youth Ministry in Tijuana.

Inmaculada, which in turn is the order of the sisters here in the Oblate Tijuana mission that assists in many ways with the formation of the

youth. In honor of the beautification of Maria
Riquelme, which took place last Saturday (Nov 3)
in Granada Spain, Sister Karina organized an allnight prayer vigil. Approximately 50 youths gathered at

Jesse (Oblatos), and sold treats to raise funds for the trip. They even wrote a song honoring the foundress and played it during the mass in Granada. It was a beautiful offering of appreciation by the youth out of love and respect for the sisters here in Tijuana who have been wonderfully instrumental in their formation over the years.
