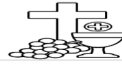

## A Message from the Pastor

Dear Beloved friends and families;

I welcome you back, and I truly hope that you had a great and productive week. It is always good to welcome you back after a week away from each other. I also pray that you and your loved ones are safe and secure. Please know that you have been in my thoughts and prayers throughout the week. My friends, as we know the pandemic is still with us and to remain careful and vigilant is extremely important. Yes, we often say we did not see that coming, and we were not ready to face this terrible pandemic. However, we are not alone in this journey because Jesus continues to order our every steps. Therefore, we need to give testimony about how good God has been to us throughout these difficult and challenging times.

Just a reminder: In the weekend's Gospel, the Pharisees attempted to test Jesus with the question about divorce. In response, Jesus challenged them about the hardness of their hearts. In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus faced a man who asked Him the following question; "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" In response, Jesus asked him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone." Indeed, Jesus revoked the commandments and told the man; "You know the commandments but are lacking one thing. Go and sell what you have and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven, then come and follow me."

Beloved friends, today, we are the man to whom Jesus made it clear that he was lacking in one thing. So let us ask ourselves what exactly is the one thing that we are lacking of, what can cause us the obstacles which can prevent us from inheriting eternal life. As a faith community and individually, let us ask the Master, the one who calls us to follow Him to help us to get rid of anything that can prevent us from inheriting God's Kingdom. We are living in a world controlled by material possessions, power and all kinds of temptations. We did not call ourselves, but Jesus calls us and God's grace is sufficient. Let us ask God to give the grace that we need so that we may be able to see clearly and to understand what could serve us as obstacles which can prevent us from inheriting the Kingdom of God.
