### **What Happens When:**

- **Contact Tracing**
- **Student Tests Positive**
- **Student Comes In Contact with Someone Who Tested Positive**

### **Contact Tracing**

When someone tests positive for COVID-19, the Washington Ozaukee Health Department will conduct “contact tracing” to quickly identify, assess, and isolate people who have been exposed to COVID-19. When a student or teacher / staff of the school test positive for COVID-19, the Washington Ozaukee Health Department will contact Lumen Christi to create a list of close contacts while at school. **Close contacts** include individuals who have been within 6 feet of the student for at least 15 minutes. Contacts are only informed that they may have been exposed to a patient with the infection. They are not told the identity of the patient who may have been exposed to them.

- Individuals are considered close contacts even if they have worn a cloth face mask.
- Individuals are considered close contacts if the contact is outside.

Lumen Christ will be responsible for notifying close contacts at school on behalf of the Washington Ozaukee Health Department. This will be done via email.

We will be managing the following groups as “cohorts”, meaning everyone in the group is considered a “close contact”:

- **Homeroom for 3K - 5th grade:** For example, Mrs Wermers’ 1st grade homeroom will not interact with Mrs Paulson’s 1st grade homeroom.
- **Grade for 6th - 8th grade:** Students in 6th - 8th grade will be switched within their grade once per day.

### **When a Student Tests Positive**

When a student tests positive for COVID-19 or comes into close contact with someone that tests positive for COVID-19, he or she will need to transition into virtual instruction. Close contact is defined as being within six feet of someone that tested positive for COVID-19 for at least fifteen cumulative minutes over a 24-hour period. Close contact will be determined based on the

findings of Lumen Christi’s and Washington Ozaukee Health Department’s contact tracing efforts.

**When a Student Tests Positive or a Student has been in “Close Contact” with a Positive Case**

The following chart delineates how long students in such situations will need to participate in virtual instruction before being able to attend in-person instruction again. Please stay in contact with your healthcare provider, our school office, and the local health department. They will guide you through the quarantine and isolation process, and will determine the best date for returning to on campus instruction for your student.

A negative test does not change the quarantine timeframe or the number of days the student is assigned for virtual instruction.

IF	THEN	Calendar days Assigned for Virtual Instruction
Your child tests positive for COVID-19	Your child will be assigned virtual instruction for days school is in session over the course of at least 10 days. The last day prior to your child’s return to on campus instruction, your child must be symptom-free.	At least <b>10</b> From date of test or onset date
Someone in your child’s household tests positive for COVID-19	Your child will be assigned virtual instruction during the time any members of the household that test positive are isolating plus an additional fourteen calendar days after the infected member/s of the household are released from isolation. This assumes the child continues to be in direct, close contact with the household member while they are infectious. <i>If the COVID-19 positive household member is able to isolate separately from the child, the child would follow the virtual instruction guidelines for “close contacts.” This also assumes your child does not develop symptoms during the quarantine period.</i>	At least <b>20</b> From date of household member’s test onset date
Someone your child has been in “close contact” with tests positive for COVID-19	Your child will be assigned virtual instruction for days school is in session over the course of 14 days. If your child is symptom-free throughout this time your child can return to on campus instruction. <i>This assumes your child does not develop symptoms during the quarantine period.</i>	At least <b>10</b> From date of exposure
