What Happens When:

- **Student has Symptoms at Home**
- **Student has Symptoms at School**
- **When a Student Can Return to School**

When Student has Symptoms at Home

Symptoms are considered consistent with COVID-19 when experiencing any one of the following symptoms above their baseline within the last 24 hours:

- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- New loss of taste or smell
- OR at least 2 of the following symptoms
 - Fever (equal to or greater than 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit)
 - Chills
 - Muscle or body aches
 - Headache
 - Sore throat
 - Fatigue
 - Congestion or runny nose
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Diarrhea

Parents will complete a daily screening protocol and temperature check of their child prior to drop-off. If the child has symptoms as described above, the child and any siblings must stay home.

When Student has Symptoms at School

If a child is observed at school having symptoms considered consistent with COVID-19 as described above, the child and siblings will be escorted to the school's COVID-19 isolation room

and the parent called. The parent or emergency contact should arrive as soon as possible to pickup the child and siblings.

Testing Protocols

If a student has symptoms, s/he will need to have a COVID test. The test needs to be RT-PCR test. Rapid antigen tests will not be accepted. Test results should be sent to the School Office.

When a Student can Return to School

The table below refers to a symptomatic student that is not a positive COVID-19 case and is not a known close contact to a COVID-19 case:

Symptomatic Student	MUST DO	Calendar days Assigned for Virtual Instruction
Not tested for COVID-19	The student must remain home for at least 10 days since the first symptoms began AND be fever free without the use of fever-reducing medications for 24 hours AND with improvement of symptoms.	At least 10 From from onset date
Tested and negative for COVID-19	The student must be fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications.	0 Not assigned to virtual
Tested and positive for COVID-19	See School Protocol for a Positive COVID Case regarding when a Student Tests Positive. The student must isolate at home for at least 10 days since the first symptoms began AND be fever free without the use of fever-reducing medications for 24 hours AND with improvement of symptoms.	At least 10 From from onset date
