What Happens When:

- **Student has Symptoms at Home**
- **Student has Symptoms at Catholic Formation**
- **When a Student Can Return to Catholic Formation**

When Student has Symptoms at Home

Symptoms are considered consistent with COVID-19 when experiencing any one of the following symptoms above their baseline within the last 24 hours:

- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- New loss of taste or smell
- OR at least 2 of the following symptoms:
 - Fever (equal to or greater than 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit)
 - Chills
 - Muscle or body Aches
 - Headache
 - Sore throat
 - Fatigue
 - Congestion or runny nose
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Diarrhea

Parents will complete a screening protocol and temperature check of their child prior to drop off at Catholic Formation. If the child has symptoms as describe above, the child must stay home. A home study lesson will be sent to them from their formation leader.

When Student has Symptoms at Catholic Formation

If a student is observed at Catholic Formation having symptoms considered consistent with COVID-19 as describe above, the student will be escorted to the school's COVID-19 isolation room and the parent/guardian called. The parent or emergency contact should arrive as soon as possible to pick up the student.

When a Student can return to Catholic Formation

See the **Catholic Formation for a Positive COVID case** regarding when a student tests positive or a student comes in contact with someone who tested positive for those scenarios.

The table below refers to a symptomatic student that is not a positive COVID_19 and is not a known close contact to a COVID-19 case:

Symptomatic Catholic Formation Student	MUST DO	Calendar days until student can return to in-person Catholic Formation
Not tested for COVID-19	The CF student must remain home for at least 10 days since the first symptoms began AND be fever free without the use of fever-reducing medications for 24 hours AND with improvement of symptoms.	At least 10 days from onset date
Tested and negative for COVID-19	The CF student must be fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications	Can return when fever free for 24 hours
Tested and positive for COVID-19	See <u><i>Catholic Formation Protocol for a Positive COVID Case</i></u> regarding when a Student Tests Positive. The student must isolate at home for at least 10 days since the first symptoms began AND be fever free without the use of fever reducing medications for 24 hours AND with improvement of symptoms.	At least 10 days from onset date
