Abortion

The Protect Life Rule would let North Dakota enforce its laws protecting taxpayers from supporting abortion.

On May 22, 2018, the Trump Administration announced revisions to the federal family

planning program known as Title X. Those changes would, among other things, prevent the use of taxpayer funds abortions referrals.

In a letter to Governor Doug Burgum dated May 30, the North Dakota Catholic Conference urged the governor to express "support for the new rules and direct the North Dakota Department of Health to submit comments in support of the revisions during the rule-making comment period."

Planned Parenthood and the abortion lobby are aggressively opposing the revisions and are recruiting governors and state officials to fight the changes. The Trump Administration needs to hear from state officials in pro-life states. Contact Governor Burgum and ask him to submit comments to the Department of Health and Human Services in support of the proposed revisions.

In a statement praising the Administration's action, Cardinal Timothy Dolan, chair of the U.S. Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities said that these regulations are "greatly needed and deeply appreciated." Cardinal Dolan also said, "Most Americans recognize that abortion is distinct from family planning and has no place in a taxpayer-funded family planning program. For too long, Title X has been used to subsidize the abortion industry."

The Administration has opened a 60-day comment period ending on July 31, 2018 and is accepting comments on the proposed rule. Planned Parenthood and other abortion purveyors will flood the Administration with negative comments. It is very important that the Pro-Life Community write to the Administration also to show our strong support for these regulations.

Message: ***Taxpayer dollars should not be used to refer for abortions. This is North***

Dakota law. Proposed revisions to the Title X program by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services would prevent abortion facilities from receiving direct and indirect taxpayer support and allow North Dakota to enforce its own law. Please show your support for North Dakota law by submitting comments to DHHS in support of the revisions.

In the Gospel and readings this Sunday, we are reminded of this beautiful time in our lives, realizing the source of such life-giving fruit. In many ways, it came from accepting things were changing and trusting we were called out of our lives for something new God had in store for us ahead.

The Gospel clearly speaks of this same reality of changing and trusting. Jesus beckons his disciples to a life that will be richer than anything they are leaving behind. Though suffering will most definitely be their lot, so also will unspeakable joy and the fulfillment of every desire of their hearts. At the moment Jesus begins sending them out, they had at least a little trepidation. Did they feel nostalgic and want things to stay the way they were? After all, they were the closest friends of Jesus. Were they at least a little sad about leaving the routines so familiar to them? Did they want to soak in the peaceful and joyful times just a little longer? Jesus asks them to go out from their comfort zone without their comfort objects. Travel with no extra clothes, no extra food, no extra money. I think most people would pause for a minute before this bold invitation. But they move forward anyway with trust and love in their hearts. God shows us His glory and unending care in these moments of trust.

The Second Reading is overflowing with this language of love and providential care. "In him we were also chosen." We were chosen to be his disciples and to receive the call to go out into the world and share the good news. Every grace necessary will be ours, just like it was for them. Like the first disciples, this might look scary sometimes. God's will might take us away from our worldly comforts, but in exchange, He gives us "redemption by his blood," an open invitation to live in communion with Him forever. This promise and lavishness is ours, but only if we practice accepting God's will and letting go in order to go where He sends us.

I look to the current state of immigration in our country. Sadly, the U.S. has become somewhat of a battleground for the poor trying to find a safe haven. Almost daily, we're hearing stories of immigrants and those traveling with nothing but the clothes on their back being denied the right of being treated with basic human dignity. It would be easy to excuse myself from any connection to it — I'm just a stay-at-home mom ... I'm too far away ... there's nothing I can do on my own. But I have a feeling that this is a lot like Amos. Regardless of my complaints, God would still like to use me to preach the Gospel through my actions toward the poor. This may require more letting go and accepting of things I'd rather keep the same. But knowing how God provided for us during our move, I will pray like the Psalmist, "Lord, let us see your kindness" and allow Him to send me out and be a part of serving the poor in our country, no matter how they get here.


