Lenin the Human Bomb

Every sin is in some way a fault against the unity and harmony that should reign between us and God and among ourselves.

Midway through World War I, when Germany was heavily engaged with France and England in the Western Front, it looked like the massive Russian Empire was about to open up a second front on Germany's eastern border. Germany knew they couldn't fight on two fronts. They had to take Russia out of the picture. So they used the Devil's tactic: they sowed division. They found the famous communist revolutionary, Vladimir Lenin, who had been exiled from Russia and was living in Switzerland. They put him on a train and sent him back into Russia, to the city of St Petersburg. There, the radical revolutionary orchestrated the Russian Revolution, throwing the Empire into such disarray that they weren't able to open up the eastern front. This is what the Devil does all the time. He sows division. He spreads lies. He spreads misinformation. He tempts us to think badly of others, to speak badly of others, to think we are right and everybody else is wrong. He does it in families, in churches, in communities, in businesses. He keeps us fighting so much among ourselves; he keeps us so full of resentment and anger, that we can never experience the satisfaction and maturity that God wants for us. And as a result, our effectiveness in building up the Church and winning souls to Christ is severely diminished. Division is the Devil's work, but reconciliation and communion are Christ's work. If we want to be the Devil's disciples and experience frustration, all we have to do is sow and foster division. If we want to be Christ's disciples and experience lasting satisfaction, all we need to do is be builders of unity.

And St Paul tells us how.

Just a couple of notes that have arrived and would like to share with you:
