Jesus' image of setting hands to the plow would have been extremely eloquent for his listeners. They lived close to the land and knew about farming. They would have known that plowing fields by hand was no easy task.

The farmer hitched the plow to oxen or cattle, or sometimes even to a donkey. As the animal made its way across the field, the farmer held the handles of the plow and pressed the blade into the ground, cutting a furrow that would later be used for planting. To make the best use of the field, the furrows had to be straight. This meant keeping an eye out constantly to direct the often stubborn animals. To make sure the seeds would germinate, the furrows had to be deep. This meant keeping a firm and steady hand on the plow itself, for long periods of time, in spite of hard or rocky soil that resisted the blade of the plow. It was slow work, and exhausting.

Many times a farmer would be tempted to take a rest or relax his grip. But the plowing season was brief, because the planting seasons were brief. If the farmers didn't keep their hands to the plow, their harvest would be meager.

Following Christ is no different. Once we get into it, we discover how demanding it really is. And when difficulties and trials pop up, we are tempted to look back at the apparent ease and comfort of a self-centered life. But if we give in to that temptation, we lose. Only Christ's Kingdom lasts forever, only God can fill the deepest longings of our hearts - the hard work that fidelity to God's will requires pays for itself with eternal returns.
