RE: PRECAUTIONS AT LITURGIES DUE TO CORONAVIRUS

Due to the continuance of the flu season and because of concerns regarding the coronavirus (COVID-19), the Diocese of Fargo Liturgy Office, in consultation with Bishop Folda, offers the following guidelines regarding the celebration of Mass. The principles underlying these guidelines may also be applied to other liturgical celebrations. Please observe common sense practices for avoiding the spread of sickness:

- ⇒ All of the faithful should use proper hygiene and follow other safeguards recommended by the Center for Disease Control.
- ⇒ Parishes should also be diligent in cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched surfaces.

Regarding the celebration of Mass:

- ◇ Priests, deacons, and EMHC should practice good hygiene, washing their hands before Mass begins or even using an alcohol based anti-bacterial solution before and after distributing Holy Communion.
- ◇ Suspend the exchange of the sign of peace, or exchange only through a sign which does not use physical contact.
- ◇ Suspend the distribution of Holy Communion to the faithful via the chalice, except for those who cannot receive under the form of bread.
- ◇ Please inform the faithful that receiving communion on the hands rather than on the tongue may slightly reduce the risk of transferring viruses. Nevertheless, they may not be denied communion on the tongue. ☒ Members of the faithful should not come to Mass if they are ill. Not only are they legitimately excused from Mass when they are ill, staying home so to avoid the spread of sickness is actually an act of charity.
- ◇ Those at a higher risk of illness, namely, older adults and those who suffer from serious chronic medical conditions, may legitimately absent themselves from the celebration of Mass even if they are not ill.
- ◇ At the discretion of the pastor, holy water fonts may be emptied. For the spiritual good of the faithful, holy water in bottles may be provided for them to take, or they may bring their own containers with water to be blessed.

The threat of sickness reminds us of our fragility as human beings, and is an occasion to turn to the Lord in prayer. The following is a list of possible liturgical prayers that may be used. In addition, please keep all those who are ill and those who attend to them in your personal prayers.

- The Bishop of Fargo grants permission to celebrate the Mass for Various Needs #48 – “For Any Need” specifically for this threat to public health. It may be celebrated on weekdays, but not on Sundays of Lent or Easter or on Solemnities.
- One or more of the following prayers of the faithful may suitably be used
- For those who are suffering in the current outbreak of sickness that they might be healed; let us pray to the Lord.
- For scientists, health professionals, public officials, and all who are serving the common good in this difficult and uncertain time, that they will be filled with wisdom and understanding; let us pray to the Lord.

If you are unable to attend Mass due to sickness or grave risk to your personal health, it is beneficial to make a spiritual communion. Also, Mass on is televised on Sundays on the following stations:

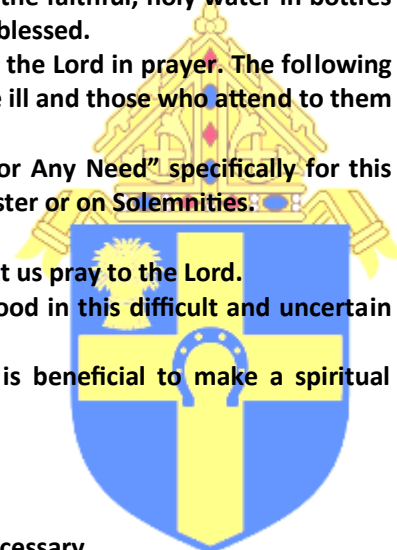
