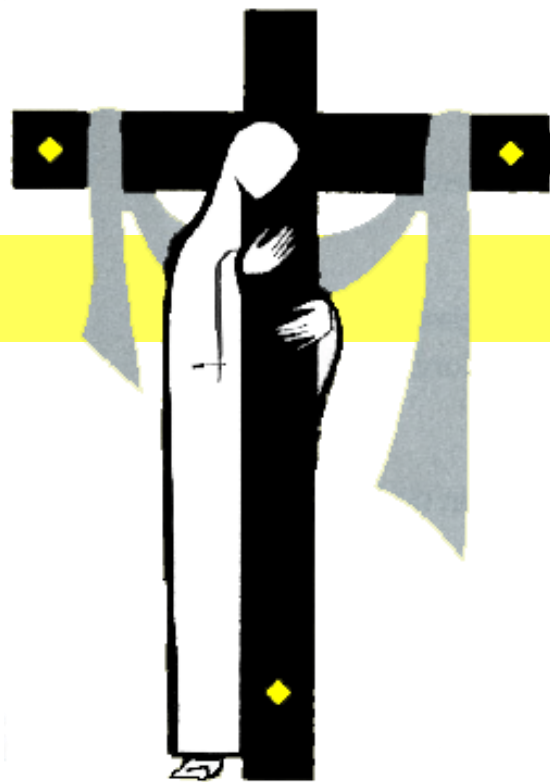

Sr Thomas Welder OSB died this past Monday, June 22 about 1am after succumbing to kidney cancer. The reason I note this in the bulletin is that she was one of my teachers in her early years when she was on the staff of "Mary College", now the University of Mary. She was one of the team teachers that took on the freshman class of 1970 in the humanities program. To this very day I still question one of the movies that was presented entitled the "Red Balloon." She lived the tradition of the Benedictine life, greeting all that she would meet and welcome them as one would receive Christ in their home. There were many wonderful nuns who came forward from this Monastery of the Annunciation and educated a great number of people across the globe, from the medical arts into so many other disciplines of learning. She learned from the best, the sisters that formed her, and she passed that on to countless other people seeking both God and his blessings in this world and in the next. Please remember her and the other nuns of the Benedictine tradition who have helped shape our world, light a candle for all women of faith who have given their lives in service to others. Located on the top of a bluff south of Bismarck, overlooking the Missouri river, there are now a number of buildings that encompass what is now the University of Mary, and the Monastery of the Annunciation. I give thanks to God for this group of nuns who shared a mission of service to the community of North Dakota with it's only Catholic University in the state. Additionally, through the Benedictine influence, I, too, sought what God was calling of me, and I am what I believe to be accurate, the only Catholic priest to graduate from "Mary College". The nuns took a chance on this young Dakotah Native American from Fort Totten ND and helped him graduate and later in life to give service to others through the priesthood of Jesus Christ. Here's to you Sister Thomas and your "red balloon" and to all the other Sisters who taught at this institution of excellence.

**St Benedict on Hospitality**  
 Hospitality is one of the cornerstones of Benedictine spirituality, and it is based on seeing Christ in the guest, just as he is seen in the monks. In the Rule of St. Benedict (source) Chapter LIII is dedicated to the reception of guests.

Christ told his disciples that their service and disservice to others would also be directed at him, and this teaching is the foundation for the Benedictine attitude on hospitality: "Let all guests who arrive be received as Christ, because He will say: 'I was a stranger and you took Me in' (Mt 25:35). And let due honor be shown to all, especially to those 'of the household of the faith' (Gal 6:10) and to wayfarers."

When a guest arrives the Rule of St. Benedict prescribes that he be greeted by the superior and the brothers, and they all pray together before anything else. The Abbot attends to the guest and teaches the guest about "divine law."

Hospitality also involves flexibility: in the Rule, it prescribes a separate kitchen attended to by a couple of monks to attend to the guests' needs even when they are not following the monastery's schedule for meal times and other activities.
