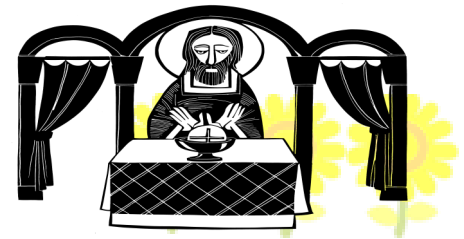

Blessed Stanley Rother, a native from a small town in Oklahoma who was declared blessed in September 2017 by the Catholic Church. One of the newest blesseds, he became a priest and missionary at a parish in Santiago Atitlán, Guatemala. He served the local Tz'utujil people at the time of the Guatemalan civil war, where he was on a hit list and eventually assassinated on July 28, 1981.

Blessed Stanley Rother is the first American-born martyr. He faced danger to his own life in Guatemala, since his name was on a hit list. For safety he returned home, but he returned back to the people he served for Holy Week. He stated that a "shepherd cannot run from his flock." Less than four months later, he was killed.

Fr Rother was born March 27, 1935 in Orarche, Oklahoma and he entered the seminary after graduating from Holy Trinity High School. He struggled in the seminary, failing several classes and even out of one seminary before graduating from Mount St Mary's in Maryland. He was

ordained a priest of the Diocese of Oklahoma City and Tulsa in 1963. The work ethic that Fr Rother learned came from his family's farm and this would serve him well when he joined the diocese mission in Santiago Atitlan, Guatemala.

The morning of July 28, 1981, three Ladinos, the non-indigenous men who had been fighting the native people and rural poor in Guatemala since the 1960s broke into Fr. Rother's rectory. They wished to disappear him, but he refused. Not

wanting to endanger the others at the parish mission, he struggled but did not call for help. Fifteen minutes and two gunshots later, Father Stanley was dead and the men fled the mission grounds.

Though his body was buried in Okarche, Fr Rother's heart was enshrined in the church of Santiago Atitlan where he served. Fr Rother's cause for beatification was opened in 2007, and his martyrdom was recognized by the Vatican in December 2016 which cleared the way for his beatification on September 2017, one step below sainthood.

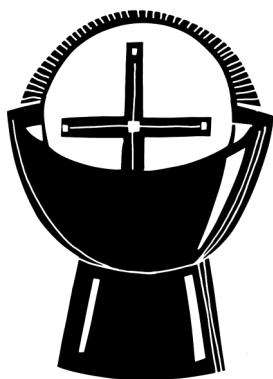

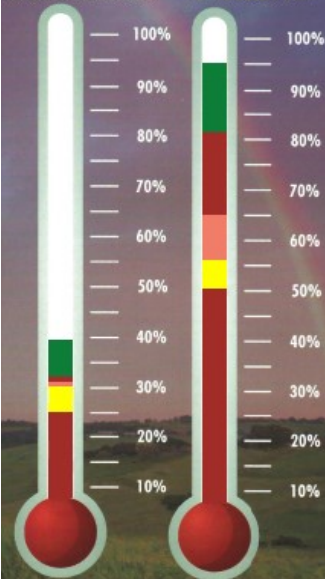
