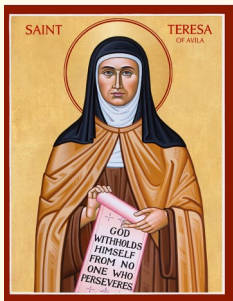

First Council of Nicaea

The First Council of Nicaea was the first Trinitarian Council in the 4th century (325 AD). Called by Emperor Constantine to battle the prominent heresy of Arianism—the rejection of the divinity of Christ—the ecumenical council sought to define the Church’s doctrine of the Most Holy Trinity. The council debate was so contentious, that a fistfight broke out between Arius and St. Nicholas of Myra. The council established the Nicene Creed and infallibly declared the Divinity of Jesus. The council clarified that there is one God and three Persons: the Father (the Creator), Jesus Christ (the only begotten Son of God), and the Holy Spirit, which proceeds from the Father and the Son. The council concluded that Jesus is not a creature made by the Father. Rather the council used a Greek word, homoousios, today translated consubstantial, emanating from the Father’s substance, “begotten, not made.” The Father and the Son are “one in being,” coequal and coeternal. Arianism, which had corrupted much of the hierarchy at the time, was declared a heresy.



St. Teresa of Avila, Doctor of the Church

St. Teresa was born in Avila, Spain in 1515 into a holy family. From a young age, St. Teresa expressed an interest in the lives of saints and even attempted being martyred by the Moors, but did not succeed. As an adolescent, Teresa began giving more attention to her appearance and as a result, was sent by her Father to an Augustinian convent. She returned after illness struck her, but began discerning religious life. She entered the Carmelite convent of the Incarnation and called for a return to tradition after a terrifying vision of hell and experiences as a great mystic. She founded 16 new convents and inspired St. John of the Cross to reform the Carmelite monks. She was canonized in 1622 and is the patron saint of headache sufferers.

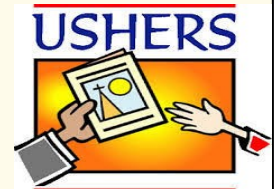
