MARRIAGE

We are unable to accommodate all of the requests for weddings at Stella Maris. To marry here, at least one party to the marriage should be an active parishioner, regularly attending Mass for one year before asking to schedule a wedding. As Catholics, we believe that God has a plan for marriage. Cohabitation before marriage is not part of God's plan and decreases the chances of success in maintaining a permanent union. Cohabiting couples should separate and live apart before requesting the Sacrament of Matrimony. More information is available from the parish office regarding guidelines for weddings and parishioner status. Diocesan policy requires at least six months' notice before setting a wedding date.

SACRAMENTAL POLICY

In order to receive First Holy Communion or Confirmation, students in Grades 2 and 8 must attend TWO FULL YEARS of religious instructions if they are NOT in our Catholic School system. No more than THREE (3) classes can be missed during the year of sacramental preparation.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My dear people,

A blessed and happy new year to all! With today's Feast of the Epiphany, the well-known twelve days of Christmas come to an end. In the Church's calendar next Sunday's feast of the Baptism of the Lord is the official end of the Christmas Season. In more traditional times and places the Christmas celebration goes until February 2, the Feast of the presentation of the Lord in the temple.

This Tuesday, our Men's Club looks forward to a guest speaker, (Ret.) Col. Andy Solgere, USMC. As we look forward to a new year, I encourage all men to check out the Men's Club, a monthly gathering with enjoyable fellowship and good food.

With every new year, we have hopes, aspirations, and resolutions. In the life of the Church, I think we must all continue our efforts towards the purification of the Church, especially in its leadership (and in ourselves). It starts at the top and if Pope Francis is going to be the reformer that he was elected to be, he must respond to Archbishop Vigano and explain how he restored the predator, the former Cardinal McCarrick, to an active role in Church leadership after Pope Benedict had sanctioned him. Recently, I have been quiet on this subject for the sake of the Christmas celebration, its message of peace and hope, but I think it our duty to press on. The Pope's response that he does not intend to say a word about this is unacceptable. This week, I was actually thankful to read that Greg Burke, the Director of the Vatican Press Office, has resigned. I have watched Greg Burke rise from a Rome reporter for the Knights of Columbus magazine to a Fox News Vatican correspondent to the Vatican Press Office. I had actually thought about writing to him to express my concern for his soul as spokesman for the Vatican in its present state.

Over the Christmas holiday, I did receive a response from Cardinal O'Malley to our parish petition regarding the McCarrick scandal. Remember this petition was written before Archbishop Vigano's assertion that Pope Francis restored McCarrick to an active role in Church leadership. Our parish petition was sent to all the American cardinals with some 700 actual signatures. The online version had some 7,000 signatures. Cardinal O'Malley is the only American Cardinal who has responded. I will make copies of his letter available in the hall and church. Next month, Pope Francis will host a meeting in Rome to address this crisis. We must watch carefully and support reform. Already there is concern as Pope Francis has named Cardinal Cupich of Chicago as a leader of this meeting. You might remember him. He's the one who infamously said that Pope Francis did not have time to respond to Archbishop Vigano's assertions about McCarrick as Pope Francis had greater concerns such as immigration and the environment. Folks, the media were actually joking about the Cupich statement so he issued a response that included the same inane remarks. You will hear more from me on this. For now, please pray for personal sanctification and the sanctification of the Church, pray for the dedicated and good workers in the Vatican. You might also want to examine your contributions to all causes beyond our parish and the Diocese of Charleston. Some are worthy causes; some are not. More later ...
