MARRIAGE

We are unable to accommodate all of the requests for weddings at Stella Maris. To marry here, at least one party to the marriage should be an active parishioner, regularly attending Mass for one year before asking to schedule a wedding. As Catholics, we believe that God has a plan for marriage. Cohabitation before marriage is not part of God’s plan and decreases the chances of success in maintaining a permanent union. Cohabiting couples should separate and live apart before requesting the Sacrament of Matrimony. More information is available from the parish office regarding guidelines for weddings and parishioner status. Diocesan policy requires at least six months’ notice before setting a wedding date.

SACRAMENTAL POLICY

In order to receive First Holy Communion or Confirmation, students in Grades 2 and 8 must attend TWO FULL YEARS of religious instructions if they are NOT in our Catholic School system. No more than THREE (3) classes can be missed during the year of sacramental preparation.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My dear people,

Ever so slowly, things are quieting down for summer. Normally, our Christ Our King-Stella Maris School graduation might mark the unofficial start of this annual hiatus. Next Sunday (June 20), the evening procession against tempests and flooding should be our final liturgical/devotional "extra" for a while. Meantime, as the schedule lightens up, people are returning to Mass and we are trying to adapt every week, which is great.

The **Procession Against Tempests and Flooding** is scheduled for 6:30 P.M. Sunday, June 20 (weather permitting). Yes, there is a wry irony in needing good weather for an outdoor procession against storms! As explained earlier, for some time (especially after the church flooded twice) we have talked about invoking traditional forms of prayer for protection during hurricane season. An Order of Worship was actually developed within the last two years. Experience showed that as storms developed and approached, people were far too busy to think about organizing a procession. After the Latin Mass, the clergy will change to appropriate garb and our relic of the true cross will be set out. The ceremonies begin inside the church, then the procession forms. The laity should follow the choir. During the procession, the choir will lead us in the Litany of the Saints. The Blessing Against Floods typically goes to the river or body of water that might flood. Because we live on an island, we will go to the four points of the compass. There, the beginning of the four Gospels will be proclaimed along with prayers and an invocation for protection with a blessing by a relic of the instrument of our salvation. The procession will return to the church for closing prayers. All are welcome.

The annual Peter's Pence collection is set for June 27. The proceeds go to the operating expenses of the Holy See and the charitable works of the Bishop of Rome. Unfortunately for Pope Francis, many Catholics are deeply disappointed in his leadership. News that he had restored the former and disgraced Cardinal McCarrick to an active role (after Pope Benedict had sanctioned McCarrick) shocked and saddened Catholics from one end of the theological spectrum to the other. If so inclined, support the Peter's Pence; if not, you can note three options for which we provide handouts: "Aids Orphans Rising" (a great work of the Religious Sisters Filipini in Africa); The Cardinal Kung Foundation which assists the suffering Church in China; and the Benedictine monastery in Norcia, Italy, a mostly American community which preserves the Traditional Mass and Divine Office. There are many more options, of course.

Having completed Frank Sheed's *Theology and Sanity*, our **Men's Reading Group** will take a break for a few weeks. We meet again starting on July 9. Our next book is Jordan Peterson's *Beyond Order, 12 More Rules for Life*. Sponsored by our Men's Club, the group usually meets on Fridays at 6:30 A.M. in the church for Mass, adjourns to the hall for breakfast, followed by discussion until about 8:00 A.M.

Speaking of **Nocturnal Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament**, we have not observed this form of devotion in over a year. Are we ready to resume? If you are able to participate, please sign up for an hour between 8:00 P.M. Thursday, July 1, and 8:00 A.M. Friday. Praying that the best of our nation may be preserved and cherished would be a fitting prelude to the Fourth of July weekend. Depending on your response to the signup, we will determine whether to proceed.

Are there any reports from the creeks? I guess I'll just have to go myself to check if and when things quiet down. Have a good week.
