MARRIAGE

We are unable to accommodate all of the requests for weddings at Stella Maris. To marry here, at least one party to the marriage should be an active parishioner, regularly attending Mass for one year before asking to schedule a wedding. As Catholics, we believe that God has a plan for marriage. Cohabitation before marriage is not part of God’s plan and decreases the chances of success in maintaining a permanent union. Cohabiting couples should separate and live apart before requesting the Sacrament of Matrimony. More information is available from the parish office regarding guidelines for weddings and parishioner status. Diocesan policy requires at least six months’ notice before setting a wedding date.

SACRAMENTAL POLICY

In order to receive First Holy Communion or Confirmation, students in Grades 2 and 8 must attend TWO FULL YEARS of religious instructions if they are NOT in our Catholic School system. No more than THREE (3) classes can be missed during the year of sacramental preparation.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My dear people,

Many of you are just too kind: last Sunday you let me go through three Masses honoring Fathers' Day and praying for all fathers before someone let me know that it was NOT Fathers' Day last week. Sandra Tawes told me she went home from church and began preparing a Fathers' Day dinner. Now, we have to wonder if Sandra ("She-Ain't-Right") Tawes will cook another dinner or serve leftovers from last Sunday's.

TODAY we honor our fathers and their noble vocation. There is a quiet greatness in all that fathers do as providers, protectors, role models, teachers, husbands, dads, and much more. Because fathers serve daily in so many ways, it is all too easy to take them for granted. As one mark of our gratitude, we especially pray for all fathers today, the living and deceased.

Our procession for protection from storms and flooding is set for tonight (Sunday, June 20) at 6:30 P.M. Already, the tropics are getting active. For some years, we have talked about having this prayerful devotion when storms are approaching. Experience showed that by the time hurricanes are threatening, people are so busy with preparations, that it is not practical to invite them out to the Island for a para-liturgical service. And, yes, I repeat the irony noted in this column last week: the procession against storms and flooding will take place "weather permitting".

Last Sunday was our first weekend of full seating since the pandemic began. It was most uplifting and felt so right. Experiencing the normal again, gave me pause to wonder at the last fifteen months. In some respects, it seemed like a long, bad dream. As for pandemic procedures, I received a few questions about our latest adaptations. When the notice went out that we will continue to transmit all Sunday Masses to the Hall via closed circuit, I meant all Masses for Sunday obligation which includes the Saturday evening Vigil Mass. Transmission requires working equipment, of course, and last weekend there were glitches. Intermittent problems are the worst. By the time for the 9:30 A.M. Mass Sunday, it was determined that the FM transmitter was causing the problem with the sound to the Hall. **We have disconnected the FM transmitter and will no longer convey Masses via radio.** My sense is that few, if any, people were sitting outside and listening in their cars.

The signup for **Nocturnal Adoration** for the night of July 1 is **experimental**. We are trying to determine whether we have enough people to resume the devotion. If you sign up, please stay attentive for announcements as to whether we can have adoration all night. The list is in the vestibule of the church.

June is slipping by quickly. Reports from the creek have been sparse although I have heard that the crabs are not running along the immediate coast, but can be found farther upstream in brackish waters. My father always said we need a good stretch of very hot weather to get them moving. With jumbo lump crabmeat selling for over \$40.00 a pound, let's hope for a good season.
