MARRIAGE

We are unable to accommodate all of the requests for weddings at Stella Maris. To marry here, at least one party to the marriage should be an active parishioner, regularly attending Mass for one year before asking to schedule a wedding. As Catholics, we believe that God has a plan for marriage. Cohabitation before marriage is not part of God’s plan and decreases the chances of success in maintaining a permanent union. Cohabiting couples should separate and live apart before requesting the Sacrament of Matrimony. More information is available from the parish office regarding guidelines for weddings and parishioner status. Diocesan policy requires at least six months’ notice before setting a wedding date.

SACRAMENTAL POLICY

In order to receive First Holy Communion or Confirmation, students in Grades 2 and 8 must attend TWO FULL YEARS of religious instructions if they are NOT in our Catholic School system. No more than THREE (3) classes can be missed during the year of sacramental preparation.

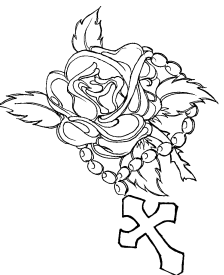

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My dear people,

Thanks go to all who showed for the first session of altar server training this past Tuesday. Our next session is this Tuesday at 4:30 P.M. Please remember that new servers are asked to attend at least 3 of the 4 planned practices. Also, all present servers are invited for a refresher and to help with the novices.

It may seem strange that your pastor would be cautious in the exercise of faith and hope, but I will admit to some superstition. Thus far this hurricane season, I have not shared many thoughts about the local calm in terms of tropical systems and storms lest I be a "jinx". Mid October, c. 1999 is the latest period I can recall that we have been under any sort of storm warning. Recently, a news account mentioned a local Halloween Storm in the 1800's. With no guarantees, therefore, let me share some thoughts as recent forecasts show tropical storms forming and computer models predicting northern and northeastern turns: I picture Our Lady, Star of the Sea, blowing the storms away from us (which, of course, she does not do) or persuading the Holy Spirit to move the steering currents (like that strong driving wind at Pentecost). Then, I keep remembering Sunday, June 27. For the first time ever, we went to the traditional Roman Ritual and conducted a procession against tempests and flooding. In addition to the Litany of the Saints, we chanted the Litany of Our Lady as we went to the four corners of the compass on church property with prayers and a blessing with a relic of the True Cross. I think we should plan to do this again next year. It works for me!

As November approaches, we are planning our customary Latin Sung Requiem Mass for All Souls' Day, Tuesday, November 2 at 6:00 P.M. This is probably the most popular of our Latin Mass celebrations every year. I mention it now to invite those who have lost loved ones since last November 2 to complete and return the cards with the names of the deceased (pronunciation and other information) so that we can memorialize them before the Mass begins. Also, please note that with All Saints (November 1) falling on a Monday this year, there is no obligation to attend Mass. For those who wish to observe the Feast, Fr. Michael will celebrate a Novus Ordo Mass at Noon. I will celebrate a Traditional Latin Mass at 6:30 P.M. There will be no Novena on November 1.

May the beauty of October lift your hearts and souls.
