Arrangements must be made six months before the tentative date of the marriage by calling the Parish Office.

ANOINTING THE SICK:

This sacrament is for those who are elderly, seriously ill, or scheduled for surgery. Contact the Parish Office to schedule the anointing in Church or at home. If in hospital, request the Catholic Chaplain or a priest from the Parish in which the hospital is located, through the nursing station.

COMMUNION FOR THE HOMEBOUND:

Contact the Parish Office if you or a family member cannot attend Sunday Mass and would like to receive the Eucharist at home during the week.

Welcome to our community. You are invited to register in the parish on each 2nd Sunday of the month in the vestibule after Mass, by coming to the Parish Office during regular business hours, or by completing a "Welcome Card" found in the pamphlet rack at the entrance of the Church and mailing it to the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is a process by which adults prepare to enter fully into the Catholic Church through Baptism, Confirmation or Eucharist. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

A LETTER FROM FR. MAZZA

January 30, 2019

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

I pray for God's blessings on you and your family as this letter arrives in your home. I am sending one to every family on our mailing list. Clearly, I would not do so, unless it was important to our work here at Immaculate Heart of Mary Church. I kindly ask that you take just a few minutes to read these few though inadequate words.

In preparing to write to you I spent some time re-reading St. Mark's Gospel, chapter 4:35-41. We find Jesus and the Apostles at sea in a turbulent storm. The Apostles are frightened and believe the boat will sink, though "Jesus was in the stern, asleep on a cushion." The Apostles cry out to Jesus, wake Him, and He responds by calming the storm. Then Jesus says: "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?"

The Church is sometimes called the Bark (Barque), or ship, of St. Peter, because of this Gospel account. During its long history the Church has experienced many trials. Yet the successors of the Apostles and the Christian Faithful continue to look to Jesus to calm all storms and bring us His peace. What Jesus did then He promises to continue to do for us now. That is the key thought we use in our interpretation of the Gospel.

With this letter I formally initiate the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal (AAA) for 2019 in our parish. As a priest for almost forty years, I can readily testify to the need for this campaign to financially support the ministry that unites all of the parishes in the Archdiocese of San Francisco. Marriage counseling, youth ministry, religious education, the Catholic Press, charitable institutions, our seminarians, our retired priests, and much more, benefit from your donations. There is a tremendous harvest awaiting the response of faithful laborers. Each is called to do his or her part.

Our assessment for this year comes to \$83,531.04. Last year our goal was \$89,301.00, of which \$73,973.00 was raised directly from your generous gifts to the campaign, and \$15,328.00 came from a series of weekly collections over several months. It is financially better for us if donations come directly through the campaign, which requires a little more attention at the beginning of campaign. Pledges can be arranged to be paid out on a monthly basis until all paid up. Enclosed you will find further information (also available at the entrances of the church; in the pews; or in the parish office). Please consider making your best contribution and mailing it in today. On behalf of all those who benefit from your kindness I express to you my sincere and heartfelt thanks. If you are able to donate or are unable to donate, be assured that you are part of our prayer army that fervently prays: "Thy Kingdom come! Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven!"
