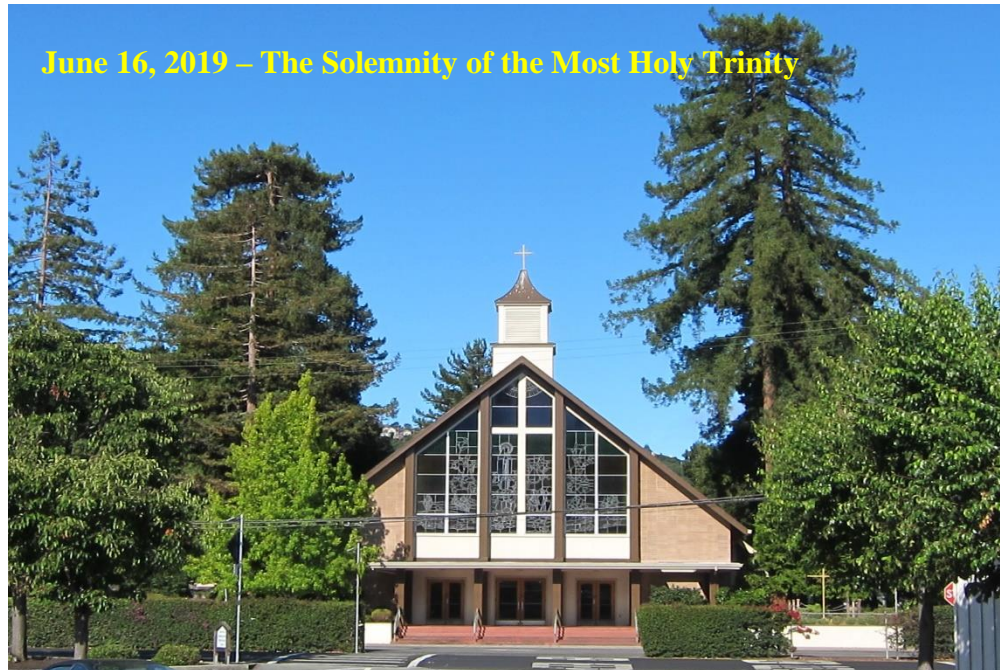

BAPTISMS:

Parents wishing to baptize children should call the Parish Office to schedule the baptism and to schedule participation in our Baptismal Preparation Program. Please call two months before you wish the Baptism. The preparation may be done before the birth of the child.

MARRIAGE:

Arrangements must be made six months before the tentative date of the marriage by calling the Parish Office.

ANointing THE SICK:

This sacrament is for those who are elderly, seriously ill, or scheduled for surgery. Contact the Parish Office to schedule the anointing in Church or at home. If in hospital, request the Catholic Chaplain or a priest from the Parish in which the hospital is located, through the nursing station.

COMMUNION FOR THE HOMEBOUND:

Contact the Parish Office if you or a family member cannot attend Sunday Mass and would like to receive the Eucharist at home during the week.

Welcome to our community. You are invited to register in the parish on each 2nd Sunday of the month in the vestibule after Mass, by coming to the Parish Office during regular business hours, or by completing a "Welcome Card" found in the pamphlet rack at the entrance of the Church and mailing it to the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is a process by which adults prepare to enter fully into the Catholic Church through Baptism, Confirmation or Eucharist. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

Sunday, June 16, 2019 – The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity



Matthew 28:18-20 Then Jesus approached and said to them, “All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.”

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Right before His Ascension into heaven, Our Lord gave the apostles the mandate recorded in Matthew 28:18-20. These solemn words remain forever true. The apostles were entrusted with the mission to make disciples, baptize, and to faithfully hand on the teachings of the Lord. This mandate, first given to the apostles, continues in our own time. The bishops, who are the successors of the apostles, and the Holy Father, who is the successor of St. Peter, the first pope, are commanded by the Lord to teach, govern, and sanctify in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ until He returns at the end of the world. This authority is considered by the faithful as the Lord’s loving gift of Himself to us so that we may know and live the Faith in its fullness and with certitude.

In an address to the Italian bishops pope Benedict XVI described well the current situation in which we Catholics find ourselves. On May 24, 2012, he said: “It is a sign of the lessening of religious practice, visible in the participation in the Eucharistic liturgy and, even more so, in the Sacrament of Penance. So many of the baptized have lost their identity and membership: they do not know the essential contents of the faith or think they can cultivate it without ecclesial mediation.” Then the pope said: “man pretends to have an identity fulfilled simply in himself.”

Pope Benedict XVI lamented that “so many of the baptized have lost their identity and membership.” The entire Church is called upon to be renewed by the Most Holy Trinity through authentic teaching, discipline, and spirituality. There is no other way and no short cut. It is the Way of the Lord, which is tried and true. He is our last, best, and only hope. We are confident that He will remain with us always, as He promised.

On this Father’s Day we should especially remember in prayer all our fathers, living and deceased. In what St. John Paul II called an increasingly “fatherless” society, Christian Fathers are called more than ever to stand tall as faithful and loving disciples of Our Lord as they strive with all their hearts to live out their holy vocations, bringing wife and children to Christ. St. Joseph, patron of Christian fathers, please pray for them and all of us.
