Dear brothers and sisters, *"God is good all the time!"*  
I am writing you this letter to bring you good news that after careful thought and prayerful discernment, the Archbishop has approved the plan for Phase 2 that is in effect. The dispensation for the Sunday Mass obligation remains in effect, so no one is required or expected to attend Mass on the weekends with this reopening. Parishioners will have an expanded opportunity to attend Mass during the weekdays. Each Mass can be reopened to a maximum allowed of **30 total people, plus up to 25** can watch the Mass and receive communion in the Parish hall. **Face coverings** are required for ministers distributing Holy Communion.

**You must** sign up for Mass by calling or texting (Kim @ 503-949-9621), facebook messaging (Kim Zuber or St. Boniface) or email to the parish office [boniface@wvi.com](mailto:boniface@wvi.com). If you call the parish office to sign up, it must be only during office hours, do not leave a message.

**PLEASE DO NOT** assume you can just come because you called, you must talk to Kim or receive a call, text or email back from the parish office or Kim.

Unfortunately, those who simply show-up for Mass will be turned away. This is due largely to public health contact tracing requirements (36 square foot space for each person in attendance 6 feet x 6 feet). First and Last name and contact number required for all attendees. Anyone with signs of symptoms of illness, do not to enter parish buildings you will be ask to return home.

**Limits on signing up:** Please be mindful of the other parishioners who want to also attend Mass. Large families of 7 or more, please limit to every other weekend.

**Rules that have been put in force per Archdiocese & government rules.** Please contact Sister Veronica Schueler, F.S.E. or Reverend Todd Molinari with any question at the Archdiocese of Portland.

**Weekday Mass times:** Wednesday-Thursday-Friday 9 am.

**Weekend Mass times:** Saturday 7pm, and Sunday 8 am & 10 am.

### "Intimidation Begets Fear"

Fear can paralyze us. It can freeze us and make us immobile. It can prevent us from both thinking and acting according to our Christian convictions. A particularly detrimental form of fear comes from intimidation. It is that kind of fear which is the concern of Jesus in today's Gospel. When Jesus said, "Do not let anyone intimidate you," he was perhaps thinking of the great prophet, Jeremiah. This man of God refused to be intimidated by attacks upon his character and plots against his life, and so he was not afraid to speak out in the name of the Lord. Jeremiah accused his people of sins against their covenant with God and warned of God's judgment upon them. He insisted that their crimes against each other were crimes against God. He condemned reliance on military pacts rather than on God, and he predicted the destruction of Jerusalem (which occurred in 587 B.C.). Jeremiah was forced into exile in Egypt by his enemies. According to one tradition he was murdered there by some of his own countrymen. These evil men are no longer remembered, but Jeremiah is. He lives not only in the pages of Sacred Scripture but with Jesus in heaven, the Messiah whom he never knew on this earth but to whom he was faithful without realizing it!

These days we are in danger of being intimidated by movements in our society. Pro-choice advocates would make us feel that we violate women's rights when we insist that abortion is an unspeakable crime. Corrosive individualism militates against our concern for the poor, the homeless and the hungry. Xenophobia and greed would bring wrath upon the immigrants whom the Church insists have human rights. Jesus says to us gathered in worship: "I see you here in church as the People of God. I will continue to acknowledge you before my Father in heaven as long as you continue to follow my teachings and not those of the people who oppose the Gospel. Do not let them intimidate you."
