# OUR LADY OF THE HOLY CROSS WOMEN'S PRAYER MINISTRY FOR PRIESTS





**Mission:** Our Lady of the Holy Cross Women's Prayer Ministry for Priests is imaged after the spiritual motherhood of Our Heavenly Mother in relation to Her Divine Son under her title of Our Lady of the Holy Cross. Our Heavenly Mother, during Her Divine Son's earthly life, and now from eternity, is always united to the Eternal High Priest, Jesus Christ, through her Immaculate and Sorrowful Heart. Our priests are called to full union with Christ Crucified on the High Altar of the Cross by virtue of their priestly ordination and through the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, which is the re-presentation of Christ's sacrifice on the Cross for the salvation of souls.

Our priests are called to a sacrificial life of spiritual fatherhood in the supernatural order of grace. By virtue of their ordination, priests undergo an ontological (deepest levels of being) change, which allows them to act *in persona Christi* (in the person of Christ) in the Mass and the Sacraments, and they become an *alter Christus* (another Christ) to the world.

Priests are called to surrender their entire being to Christ in order to bring countless souls into communion with the Most Holy Trinity. The priests of this diocese make promises of celibacy and obedience in order to live out this mission for the sake of their bride, the Church. They are called to live their priestly ministry through the threefold mission of word, sacrament, and pastoral charity (*Pastors Dabo Vobis*, 26), but they are not meant to fulfill this mission alone.

By our intercessory prayers, we offer our petitions to Our Heavenly Mother, so that through them, she may draw her priest-sons more deeply into her Immaculate and Sorrowful Heart in order to lead them into deeper union with Her Son's Most Sacred Heart where their ultimate strength lies. Our prayers and sacrifices are also meant to be a source of strength for them in the supernatural order so that they may faithfully live out their priestly ministry and become the priest-saints they are called to be in order to lead countless souls to salvation and attain



their Crown of Glory in eternity.

St. Andrew's has been blessed by God with a holy relic of the True Cross, which is also from where Our Lord entrusted His Mother with the priesthood through her first priest-son, St. John the Apostle. We seek, by God's grace, to live out this prayer ministry in the image of Our Lady united to Christ on the Cross, as well as throughout His earthly ministry, and her entrustment as both Mother and Queen of the Clergy. We are called to help carry the Cross of our priests and walk beside them through our prayers and sacrifices.

The women in our ministry dedicate time each day to prayer—especially the Rosary— for our bishop, priests, seminarians, and an increase in priestly vocations in the Diocese of Richmond, as well as the universal Church. Along with prayers, we also offer sacrifices and penances on their behalf for their increased sanctification, which will be prayerfully discerned by each member individually.

Each member is asked to make a holy hour at least once a month, either at Eucharistic Adoration or before the Tabernacle, dedicated to the clergy of the diocese. The Holy Eucharist and Holy Orders are inextricably linked. One would not exist without the other. The lifeblood of the priesthood is the Holy Eucharist and this holy hour is meant to be a time of prayer offered

up for our priests to grow in deeper union with Christ in the Most Blessed Sacrament and in greater intimacy with God through their prayer lives.

As needs come to our attention, we also provide spiritual resources for priests and seminarians. We send care packages to seminarians that include some of these spiritual resources, as well as other items to help them in their discernment process.

We encourage spiritual adoption of priests through prayerful discernment within the group, the Fraternity of St. John Men's Prayer Ministry for Priests, the parish, and the diocese. Spiritual adoption of a specific priest allows a spiritual mother or father to provide more dedicated prayerful attention to the needs of one particular priest while also praying for the priests of the diocese and the universal Church.



The ministry also seeks to encourage regular prayer for our bishop, priests, seminarians, and priestly vocations in our own parishes and communities. 
