INTROIT III - Phil 2: 10.8.11. ✠. Ps 101:2

In nomine Domini omne genu flectatur, caelestium, terrestrium et infernorum: quia Dominus factus oboediens usque ad mortem, mortem autem crucis: ideo Dominus Iesus Christus in gloria est Dei Patris. Ps. Domine exaudi orationem meam: et clamor meus ad te veniat.
