A Note from Our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

I hope your summer is going well, as we enjoy the days of abundant warmth and sunshine. Of course, we are at the point in the year when the heat can be a little too much, as we make our way into the heart of July. Nevertheless, our air conditioners keep us cool wherever we are, and so technology is there to render comfort when things can be extensive. That reminds me, I appreciate your understanding with no A/C the last two weekends in church. Our new units have been going through the process of installation, and will serve us now for years to come. The old ones lasted decades, but finally came to their limit. The new system will keep us cool, and serve in a far more energy efficient manner. It's been a few weeks of celebrating Sunday and Daily Masses together, and so many thanks to those who have joined in the church for the Eucharist, and for observing the necessary procedures and restrictions for the time being. Many have not returned yet to Mass, and that's a decision everyone needs to consider regarding their safety. We certainly hope and pray that the weeks and months ahead will see the pandemic more and more under control, and things returning to normal. Let's remember to pray for one another, those we see at Mass, and those at home watching Mass on television or the websites. Even with the process of the reopening our churches being a gradual one, it is a joy indeed to see one another again after the months away. We do everything we can to stay safe, and protect all from any infection. Everyone's concern and effort have been an important part of what we still need to do as a parish, a local community, a state, a nation, and a world together as one.

This Saturday also marks the ordination of parishioner Bernie Hayes as a permanent deacon of the archdiocese. His long course of study and formation over the past years has reached its destination. We join with him, his wife Kris, their family, and all the new deacons and their families in a spirit of joy and thanks as Cardinal Tobin ordains them and they begin their ministry. Bernie serves this Sunday at the 12:00 Noon for the first time as an ordained deacon, and will preach the homily. I thank you for your prayers and support of his journey to Holy Orders. We trust that his ministry will bless our people in the parish for years to come. Bernie joins Deacon Bill in the diaconal ministry here. We are blessed again with two deacons, the first time since Deacon Joe Niland's passing a few years ago. Deacons serve especially in the ministries of the Word, the Altar, and charity. Their service has graced the entire Church in the years since the reestablishment of the order as a permanent one and not merely a step along the way for men preparing for the priesthood. How much our parish has been a part of that great tradition with our deacons' continual presence, which began in the 1970s. As a pastor and the archdiocesan formation director for deacons since 2006, it's has been a privilege to work with these holy men. Congratulations Bernie! Thank you for saying yes to the Lord's call to you!

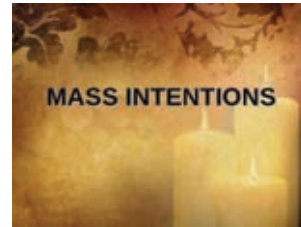

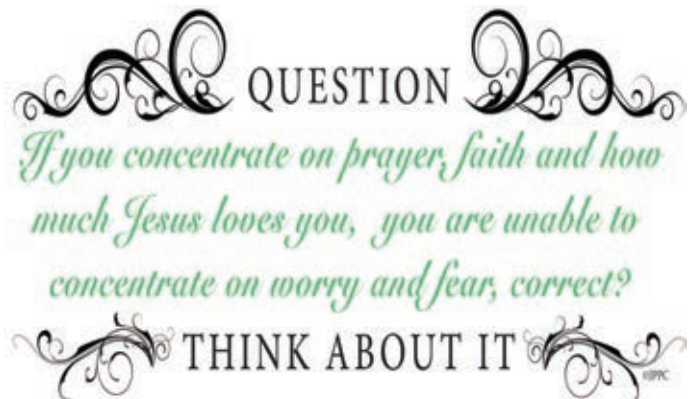

BAPTISM

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated for infants on the second and fourth weekends of each month, except during the Lenten season. The celebration may take place during the 10:30 a.m. or 12:00 p.m. Mass on Sunday, or at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday. Parents are invited to contact Judy Fanelli, even before your baby is born, so that participation in our preparation program can be arranged and the baptism planned.

RECONCILIATION

The sacrament of Reconciliation is offered in the church on Saturdays between 4:00 p.m. and 4:30 p.m. Personal appointments for other times are available and can be made by contacting Father Jim.

During the Lenten Season, a communal Celebration of Reconciliation is offered in conjunction with Our Lady of the Visitation parish.

MINISTRY TO THE ILL AND HOMEBOUND

At times, physical injury, old age, or debilitating disease prevents our parishioners from participating regularly in the celebration of the Eucharist. PARISH MEMBERSHIP

INITIATION INTO THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

The *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults* (RCIA) is a process of formation and initiation for those (age seven and older) who have never been baptized and wish to become members of the Roman Catholic Church.

Formation and initiation opportunities also exist for adults baptized into the Roman Catholic Church as infants, but who have not received the sacraments of Confirmation and/or Eucharist.

Christians baptized in Eastern Orthodox Churches or in communions other than Roman Catholic who wish to enter into the fullness of Catholic communion may also participate in the RCIA formation process.


