The Pharisees went off and plotted how they might entrap Jesus in speech. And you are not concerned with anyone's opinion, for you do not regard a person's status. Tell us, then what is your opinion: Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" He said to them, "Whose image is this and whose inscription?" They replied, "Caesar's" At that he said to them, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."
