FUEL OFFERINGS

February is also the time when we have a collection to help defray the cost of heating our buildings during the winter months. While we have been relatively lucky so far this winter, it is still a major expense for the parish. The parish pays the heating costs for the church, Family Center and rectory. The School is fully responsible for the heating costs of the school and convent building. Last year, the gas bills for the church amounted to \$19,680.05 – the Family Center cost was \$1,611.00 and the rectory bills were \$6,485.95. We received Fuel donations totaling \$4,245.79 in the annual collection and online giving. There will be a second collection next weekend for your annual donations for the fuel costs of winter. However, you can make your donation anytime during the winter months.
