As mentioned in last weekend's bulletin, Rev. John Graden, O.S.F.S. will come to our parish next weekend (July 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup>) to speak with us about the work being done by *Unbound* (formerly known as CFCA). His visit will provide us with information about a trustworthy way to actively participate in the social outreach of the Catholic Church and answer the Gospel call to serve the poor. Founded by lay Catholics, *Unbound* is an organization that has served more than 600,000 children, youth and elderly in 18 developing countries since 1981 – empowering them to make choices in their lives, live with dignity and reach their potential. The unique sponsorship program of Unbound is highly personalized. It matches a child, youth or aging person at a project overseas with a sponsor in the U.S.A. who cares about and encourages that person. With a monthly contribution, a sponsor helps to provide much-needed nourishing food, medical and dental care, the chance for a child to go to school, livelihood programs for families and much more. All these efforts are directed at affirming the dignity of every person in their local community. I pray we will warmly welcome Fr. **STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK**

"For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters. But do not use this freedom as an opportunity for the flesh; rather serve one another through love." (Galatians 5:13) We like to celebrate the fact that we are free to "live the good life." But Jesus calls us to a different kind of freedom. St. Paul reminds us that Jesus sets us free so that we can serve one another, share our gifts and promote God's work here on earth to glorify His name and not honor ourselves.

**PARISH/DIOCESAN CAPITAL CAMPAIGN**

Recognizing the financial struggles of many of our parishes and the diocesan Church, the Diocesan Finance Committees discussed with Bishop McManus the need for a Capital Campaign to attempt to further fund endowments for many diocesan needs such as Priest Retirement, Evangelization and Education and Charitable Outreach programs. They also acknowledged the needs of many of the 95 parishes and 2 missions (our own included) who are struggling to fund ministries and maintain buildings.

Bishop McManus has, therefore, announced a capital campaign that will be known as **Legacy of Hope**.

Unlike Forward in Faith that took place in 1999, this campaign seeks to begin with helping parishes solidify their financial security as well as the diocesan Church. **Forty percent of every dollar raised will come to the parish** and 60% of the money will fund the diocesan needs.

Nine parishes are already engaged in this effort that will take place in four phases. The first phase with the 9 above mentioned parishes is moving toward its completion at the end of this month. The second group of parishes – **of which we will be one** – will undertake the effort from July to the end of November of this year. The third and fourth phases will take place in 2020.

**Process:**

Fr. Monroe and the Finance Committee have met with Jon Van Beaver who will be our advisor from *Guidance in Giving*, the company hired to lead the capital campaign. He presented us with the framework for the campaign and informed us of the structures we will need to put in place.

**Needed:**

**Fr. Monroe is now asking parishioners to prayerfully consider how they might be able to help him undertake this effort.**

He needs volunteers to serve on the organizational committee and engage in simple tasks like preparing mailings and distributing material at various stages.

**He needs some one to act as the parish chairperson for the effort and several people to make up the coordinating committee.** In the Fall, we will be reaching out to all parishioners to solicit their involvement.
