LEGACY OF HOPE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

I have met with our Finance Committee and Jon van Beaver of Guidance in Giving who will be our parish's guide and support to undertake the capital campaign. As I mentioned a few weeks ago, Bishop McManus has asked all parishes to be part of this effort to build up endowments for various diocesan needs and provide parishes with funds to undertake necessary projects, pay off debts and set money aside for future needs. Forty percent of every dollar raised will be returned to the parish and the other sixty percent will fund the diocesan needs.

Our parish appeal will take place during the Fall months. Right now, we are trying to set up various committees to do the appeal. Parishioners will be invited to one of several receptions that will be held in the Rieger Hall to present the scope and purpose of the appeal and hand out pledge materials.

INTERESTED IN BECOMING CATHOLIC?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is a program for adults who desire to become fully initiated members of the Catholic Church.

RCIA helps adults grow in their relationship with God, become familiar with Catholic teachings and practices, get acquainted with the faith community and get involved in service within the community. Many people who want to join the Catholic Church have already been baptized in another Christian Church. They do not need to be rebaptized. They participate in the process with those never baptized to familiarize themselves with the Roman Catholic Tradition. Others may have been baptized in the Catholic Church and need to complete the sacraments of initiation by receiving First Eucharist and/or Confirmation.
